4.1 Chief Tyrone McNeil, Chair, Emergency Planning Secretariat

4.2 Steve Litke, Director, Water Programs, Fraser Basin Council

Steve Litke, Director, Water Programs, Fraser Basin Council, provided the Flood Resiliency Committee with a presentation on the Lower Mainland Flood Management Strategy Update highlighting the role of the Fraser Basin Council in flood management, and outlining its strategies to the risk reduction and resilience. He also provided updates on the dike infrastructure assessment, the framework for disaster risk reduction, the purposes behind the Pathways to Action Report, and outlined the next steps.

1:07 pm Vice Chair MacDonald arrived at the meeting.

Members commented on the frequency of the atmospheric river events, their impacts on the region, and the need to take collaborative approach on the flood mitigation management with all levels of governments.

Members commented on the impacts of the 2021 atmospheric river event and 2022 Fraser River freshet.

Staff were requested to report back to the Committee with the Fraser River levels at the Mission Gauge during the November 2021 flood event.
