- ≥ 50,000 annual deaths in Canada = 20 percent of all deaths
- ➤ 6,000 annual deaths in British Columbia (2017)
- ➤ 1 million Canadians suffering from resulting illnesses
- ➤ 1 in 2 smokers will die prematurely
- ➤ Secondhand smoke kills 1,000 annually; no safe level of exposure
- ➤ Economic cost is \$12 billion/year (2017)

Recent developments

- ➤ Cannabis legalization
- ➤ Substantial increase in youth/recreational vaping
- ➤ Smoking restrictions are expanding outdoors
- ➤ Alignment on smoking/vaping/cannabis restrictions
- ➤ TransLink smoking/vaping ban



Elements of a comprehensive bylaw

- ➤ Align restrictions on smoking/vaping/tobacco/nicotine/cannabis
- > Create smoke-free:
 - parks and recreation spaces
 - public events and markets
 - playgrounds, sports fields, spray parks, skate parks, etc.
 - beaches and trails
- > Establish uniform setback distance

Elements of a comprehensive bylaw

- ➤ Consider banning smoking in:
 - *hotel/motel rooms
 - group living facilities
 - public housing
 - new multi-unit housing
 - hookah smoking in public establishments
- ➤ Consider licensing the retail sale of tobacco and vaping products
- > Exemptions for Indigenous use of sacred tobacco

Purpose of uniform restrictions on smoking and vaping

- ➤ Reduce modelling to children and youth
- ➤ Maximize protection from secondhand smoke
- Easy to understand and comply
- ➤ Simplify enforcement
- ➤ Reduce litter and wildfires


