Built Assets – facilities that provide access and support land management

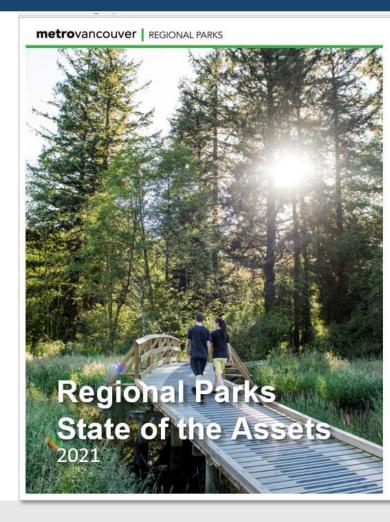

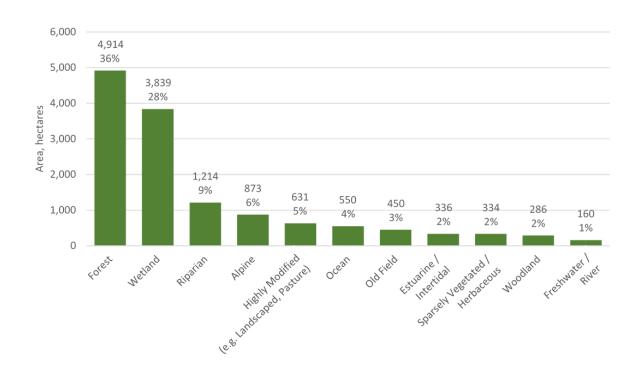

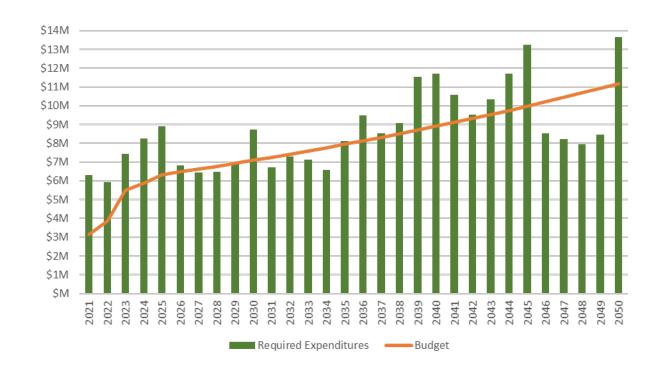

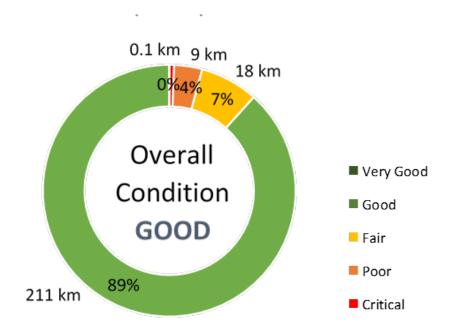

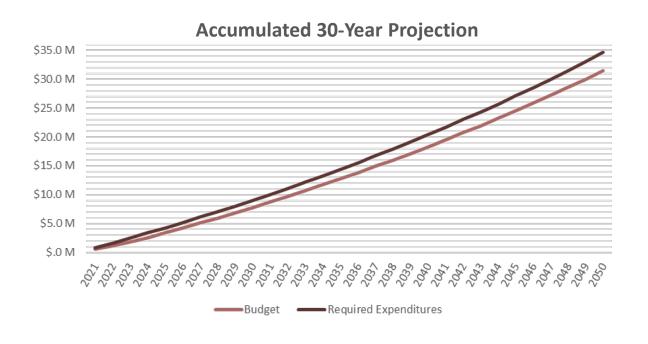


Trails – Condition Assessment

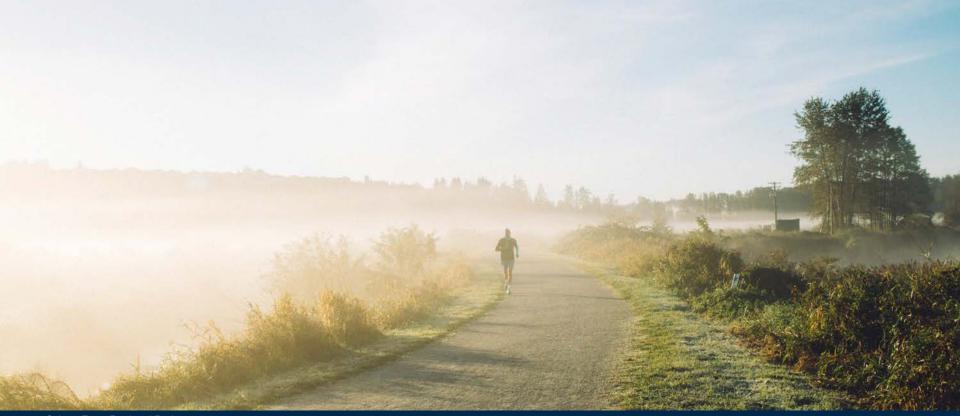
