



# **PHASE 3: 2022**

- Formal acceptance process
- Jan 2022: 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> reading
- Feb 2022: Public Hearing and 3<sup>rd</sup> reading
- March-May 2022: Council Acceptance by resolution
- June 2022: MVRD Board Adoption



### REGIONAL CONTEXT STATEMENTS

- Current RCS is effective until replaced
- New RCS due 2 years after adoption (July 2024)

- muskrat














# **PURPOSE**

Tree Regulations Toolkit

To serve as a resource on using regulatory tools that influence the preservation and growth of trees and tree canopy



### TOOLKIT DEVELOPMENT

**Consultant Analysis** 

- Practitioner Surveys
  - 14 municipal staff
  - 29 consulting arborists
- Literature and Bylaw Review
  - Best practice guides
- Emphasis on Tree Bylaws
