

IONA BEACH REGIONAL PARK

Dog Management Plan

Effective January 1, 2013



On January 1, 2013, a new dog management plan takes effect at Iona Beach Regional Park.

There are two areas in the park where dogs are not allowed -- the ponds and areas surrounding them on the park's east side. And the foreshore between Iona Jetty and North Jetty.

These are both areas with high value as wildlife habitat, especially for numerous bird species, from songbirds to raptors.

The large triangular area indicated in red above, known as the interjetty area, is part of two significant conservation areas. It forms part of the Sturgeon Bank Wildlife Management Area. And it is also a part of the recently announced Fraser River Delta "Ramsar Wetland of International Importance".

A new leash-optional trail has been designated along the lower roadway on the Iona Jetty. Just remember, even if your dog is off-leash, it must still be under your control.

All other areas in the park are designated as leash-required.
